Dear parents and care-givers,

Another busy, yet productive half term comes to a close successfully, as we have now come past the half-way mark through the academic year!

#### **Events and Activities**

Alongside the usual specialist interventions provided at the school (Speech and Language Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Wellbeing Counselling / Coaching, Danbury Outdoors Adventure Activities and Bushcraft), the children have had further opportunities to reach goals on their pathways to success.

- One-to-one appointments with our **Careers Advisor**; Louise Brazier, on 18<sup>th</sup> January and 15<sup>th</sup> February, for our Tigers and Horses classes to continue to build their careers ideas and explore opportunities.
- o **Guitar lessons** across the school, for those opting to explore their musical talent.
- First Aid Training by the British Red Cross 31<sup>st</sup> January 2024 for Tigers class. Not only is this so important
  to play our individual parts in becoming effective, responsible citizens, to be able to help others in an
  emergency, it also forms an important part of their careers training to build their CVs and help
  applications to College. Part 1 has been completed; Part 2 is to follow (dates to be confirmed).
- Essex Police Careers visit by two Schools' Liaison Officers to talk with Tigers Class about careers in the
  police force, along with the unique opportunity to have their very own question and answer sessions with
  the police. They were able to choose their own questions, to which they have always wanted to know the
  answers, but not had the chance (or courage!) to ask.

## **Children's Progress**

The children have been busily working hard as usual and I have awarded several Headteacher awards to nominees this half term. Congratulations to each of the children receiving the following awards:

- Citizen / Leadership Achievement, Reggee: Being a superb role model for new pupils joining the school
- ♦ Art, Reggee: Creating a hybrid creature!
- Personal Achievement, Dan: Overcoming a fear of heights at Danbury Outdoors

- ♦ English x 2; a pupil in Horses Class and Reggee: producing a fabulous Nonsense Poem- constructed of 'made-up words' with 'made-up meanings!'
- Character, Boedy: Being able to collaborate in learning and complete a joint glossary as a group task
- Personal Achievement, Harry: Attending every planned session on his transition plan as a new pupil

### **Update on Football Coaching, Food / Health Coaching and Swimming**

Many of your will remember me updating you shortly after we returned from the Christmas break, that Coaching Champions, the sports company who supplied our Football and Sports Coaching on Friday afternoons and Food Champions on Tuesdays (Food and Nutrition coaching) unfortunately ceased trading with no notice. We have managed to source another company to start Health and Sports Coaching on Tuesdays, and Sports Coaching on Fridays as soon as possible when we return after the half term. This is great news, so that this important learning can continue. Thank you to the staff for continuing to provide our own 'in-house PE lessons' in the meantime.

In addition, following Riverside Ice and Leisure Centre withdrawing our booking last minute in October, we have finally been able to source a new venue for swimming lessons (County High School) and swimming teacher / lifeguard, so that lessons can re-commence for the summer term, Wednesdays 17<sup>th</sup> April onwards. More details and a social story, with photos, to follow nearer the time.

### **Essex County Council Informal Monitoring**

We have also had an informal monitoring visit from Essex County Council. This is where a couple of times a year, they arrange to send the SEND Inclusion Partner who looks after certain children's cases, to come and monitor provision for the children's EHCPs to ensure that we are delivering what we have promised, and that this is having a positive impact on the children's wellbeing and education. Thank you to those of you who were contacted in the role of their parents / care-givers, for providing the necessary feedback and helping the school to give a 360° view of our provision and its impact. We have not received a report yet, but verbal feedback on the day was positive and the children gave positive feedback about their experiences here and opportunities for learning.

#### **Department for Education Approved our Material Change**

As reported during the half term, we have been waiting to hear back from the Department for Education, about our request to be able to keep certain children on roll for one extra year, allowing them to have an extra year before attending college. This provision is specifically for children being awarded school places very late in their education and who have excellent attendance, to allow extra time to build their pre-college qualifications. We were notified of our successful material change in January and are delighted that we also granted the opportunity to extend our provision for an extra pupil as well, bringing our registered number of pupils now to 13.


